Fiesta de Santiago y Santa Ana Cancelled for 2020

During this COVID-19 pandemic and for the safety and health of the community a tough decision has been made by the San Luis Board of Trustees, the Costilla County Health Department and the Sangre de Cristo Parish to cancel the annual Fiesta de Santiago y Santa Ana event.

Costilla County Public Health has had conversations with Father Damian De La Cruz Nunez, Sangre de Cristo Parish Priest, and the Town of San Luis who also add to the Santa Ana annual celebration, recommending cancellation of these activities for the continued health and safety of our community. San Luis has a large population of older residents and it is important to keep everyone safe during these uncertain times.

Large events and mass gatherings offer more opportunities for person-to-person contact and therefore pose greater risk of COVID-19 transmission. Plus, many folks come to San Luis from out of the area and out of state for this annual event. So far, Costilla County has had only a few cases and hopefully it remains that way.

Meanwhile we must all do our part to stop the spread of this virus. Please remember health officials now recommend wearing non-medical cloth masks or face coverings when you need to leave home.
